POSITION SUMMARY/ JOB OVERVIEW

The Advancement Officer is a full-time, exempt employee who reports directly to the Executive Director. The position is available as a hybrid of onsite and remote. Candidates from diverse backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply.

ESENTIAL DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with the Executive Director, senior staff, and Board leadership to develop and implement an organizational advancement strategy built upon budgetary targets.
- Manage membership by processing renewals and new accounts, acknowledging by mail and phone, and sending monthly reminders before any which will expire.
- Manage donor database system; pull reports and mailing lists.
- Lead annual appeal process: write and distribute letters and other appeal materials; send acknowledgements; organize board member phone calls and communications; track progress toward goals.
- Engage in prospect research and cultivation.
- Exceed expectations through intentional stewardship of current donors and members.
- With Executive Director, model a culture of philanthropy throughout the organization, from volunteers to employees to committee members and board members.
- Serve as a member of the Senior Leadership Team for the Theatre. As such, the Advancement Officer will report informationally to the board and serve as staff liaison to the Advancement Committee.

QUALIFICATIONS

Attributes of the Successful Candidate:

- Strong code of ethics and integrity with high degree of confidentiality.
- Proficiency with DonorPerfect or similar CRM, MS Word, Excel, and database management.
- Must be organized and able to work independently.
- Superlative interpersonal communication skills with a demonstrated ability to work well with people across a diverse range of education and social backgrounds, and to demonstrate an honest respect for each individual.

- Successful candidates will have the ability to articulate the priorities and programs of the Colonial Theatre, and identify and understand the philanthropic interests of donors.
- Applicants should be aware that the Colonial Theatre requires all staff to be fully vaccinated.
